

Gallery gets busy

THE National Gallery of the Cayman Islands is set for a busy December, with lots of interesting exhibitions set to show.

The month kicks off with the opening of 'Avril Ward: Flavours' on 1 December, a solo show by the artist. This is her second solo exhibition in Grand Cayman. Her work for this show was inspired by the pleasure of taste and is most appropriately on show at Grand Old House, in conjunction with the National Gallery from 6pm. On 7 December there will be Art Trek, where participants can learn all about Japan and create their own Japanese Abstract Wind Sock from 6.30 - 7pm.

'Emergence' is showing on 10 December, a Photography and Assemblage Art in the wake of Ivan.

38 creative artists from various disciplines as well as public relations, entertainment and marketing have mobilised to create 'Emergence', an exhibition that literally presents art out of rubble.

Each artist has worked with recycled materials and found objects that have lost their everyday use as a result of Ivan's wrath, personal items, that still retain emotional value or items found around the island that have been distorted by nature. Runs until 11 February.

Each month the Gallery presents Art Flix, a public screening of art films and documentaries relating to the history of art. This month discover the world of Michelangelo - Self-Portrait held on the 15th at 5.30pm.

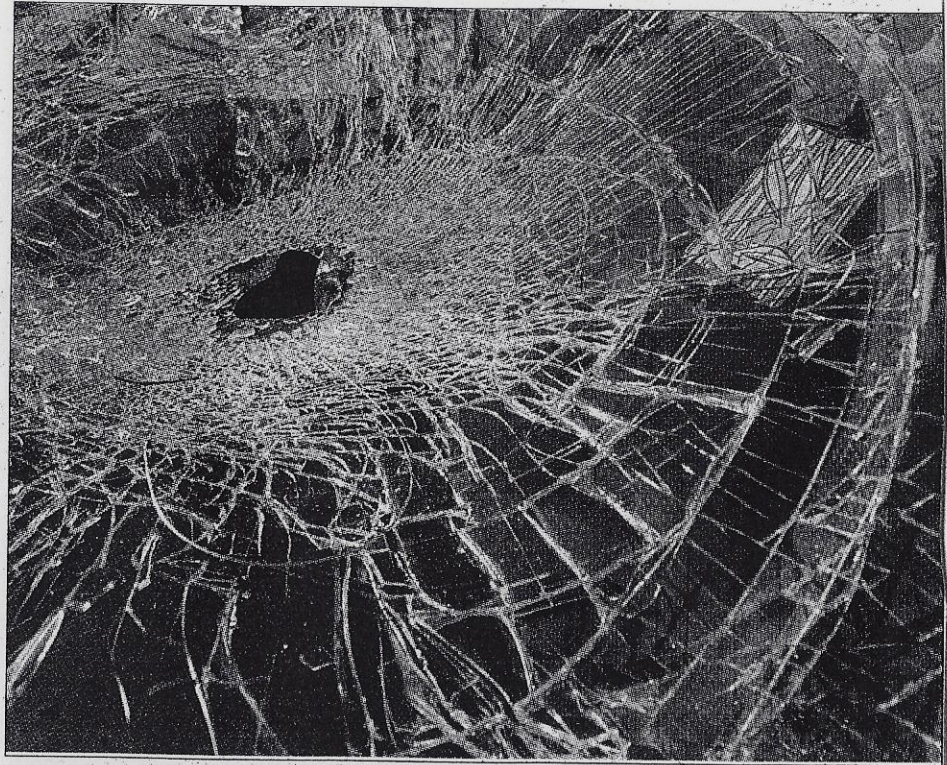


Photo from Emergence 'Ivan Spider Tree' by Courtney Platt

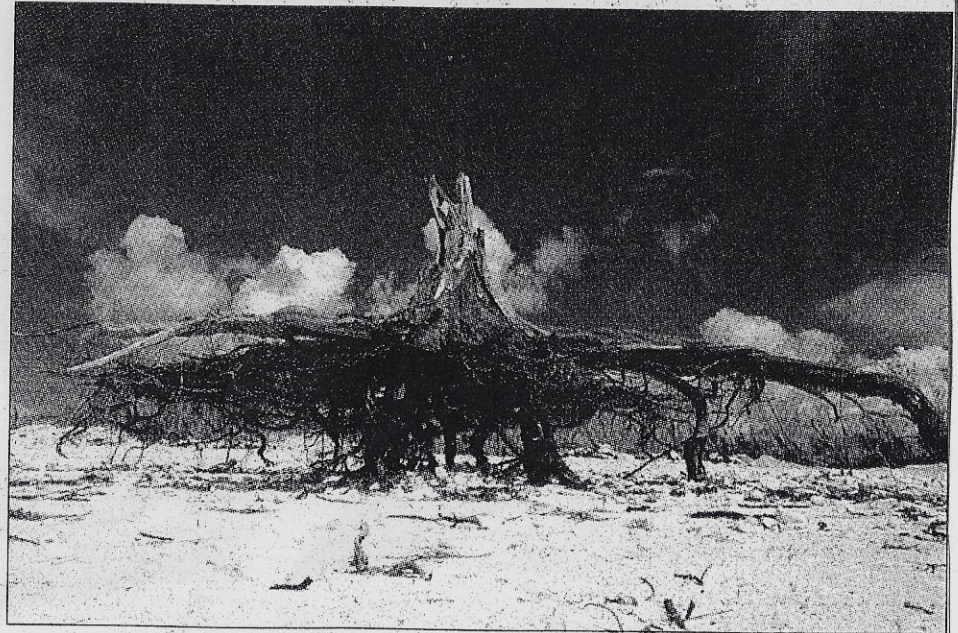


Photo from Emergence 'Ivan Self Portrait' by Courtney Platt
