





The Ching Ching is a commonly seen black bird in the Cayman Islands.

The bird gets its name from the sound it makes.



The Rolling Calf (or May Cow) is often heard about in ghost or 'duppy' stories.

Though storytellers cannot say exactly what the Rolling Calf looks like, in most stories he has red eyes and is covered in chains.
