



What do curators think about when putting together a collection or exhibition?







RESEARCH

- Talking to artists, art collectors and museum or culture professionals
- Learning about the artist(s) through reading,
 interviewing or other forms of research
- · Discovering when was the artwork made
- Thinking, does the piece represent local culture?
- · Connecting the artwork or artist to similar works

INSPECT

- Is the art in good condition?
- What material is the piece made out of?
- · Does the artwork need special care?
- Is it delicate?
- Is it old or new?
- Does the art need to be purhcased or borrowed from someone else?

VOTE AND DISCUSS

- Gathering many opinions helps the curator be sure they are properly showing local culture in a collection.
- Are the artworks in the collection good enough to show to other people? Do they represent our culture?
